Whereas the Board of Education has been authorized by the voters to raise for the current budget of the 2022-2023 school year a sum not to exceed \$6,056,686.00 (including \$294,355 for the public libraries);

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Board fixed the equalized tax rates by towns and confirm the extension of the taxes as they appear on the following described tax roll:

AND BE IT HEREBY DIRECTED THAT the tax warrant of this board, duly signed, shall be affixed to the above-described tax rolls authorizing the collection of said taxes to begin September 1, 2022, and end October 31, 2022, giving the tax warrant an effective period of 60 days, at the expiration of which time the tax collector shall make an accounting in writing to the Board: AND IT IS FURTHER DIRECTED THAT the delinquent tax penalties shall be fixed as follows: 1st month free period, 2nd month interest of 2 percent added.
